Going Deeper - March 31, 2024

Easter Sunday How To Face the Pain of Disruption

Monday: Read Habakkuk 1:13; Hebrews 4:15; Matthew 27:27-46; 2 Corinthians 5:21. Whatever disruption you are experiencing right now, Jesus has experienced worse. That is not to downplay the pain you are feeling but rather an assurance that you are never alone in your disruption. Jesus experienced the most painful disruption any human being ever could. On the cross, Jesus cried out, "My God, My God! Why have you forsaken me!" That's because God the Father had turned His back on Jesus for the very first time in all of eternity! A perfectly Holy God cannot look on sin. While Jesus never sinned and died on the cross in perfect innocence He took the sins of all who would be saved on to Himself and bore the full weight of God's anger and punishment against those sins. In doing so, the perfect unity and relationship that existed within the Trinity was torn apart while Christ suffered on the cross. None of us have ever known perfect relationship and unbroken friendship and fellowship with another being our entire life. But Christ had never known anything else because sin had never come between He and the rest of the Trinity. But in taking on that sin, that separation had to occur so that we could be reconciled to God.

Tuesday: Read Matthew 21:12-14; Matthew 27:45-54. Disruption is always painful; but embracing the pain is the road to transformation. It is a universal human response to run from pain. Our entire culture right now is built around either escaping the pain of life or seeking to numb it to a manageable level. From endless entertainment outlets to overeating to sexual immorality to drug use and abuse; we are offered endless options to mitigate our pain. But Jesus modeled a different path for us. A fully human path. He chose to embrace the pain that came with the disruption of the cross and so purchased our salvation. When disruption comes to our lives, we have to embrace the pain as a gift from the Lord. He can leverage that disruption to move us to the next place He has for us and break apart the sinful structures of our lives. Whether He causes the disruption Himself or simply uses it for His good purpose the Lord employs disruption as a merciful instrument of healing for us as a surgeon wields a scalpel. But we'll never know the blessing of healing if we continue to numb the pain of disruption. We have to embrace it, no matter how painful it is. More tomorrow.

<u>Wednesday</u>: Read John 5:1-15; Matthew 11:27-30, Romans 10:9-11, Romans 6:23, Romans 5:1-8, Luke 6:46. Disruption can lead to salvation if we respond to God in the midst of it. Every one of us will experience the pain of disruption in our lives sooner or later. In fact, we'll experience disruption again and again throughout our lives. If we run from that pain we'll never know salvation. If we keep running to alcohol or our boyfriend or Instagram or soccer the pain will never go away, it will just be numbed. We'll discover

that it will take more and more to numb it and eventually it will explode through the boundaries we've built around it. But if we embrace the pain of our life and allow it to lead us to Christ we can experience salvation. When we come to Christ He will address the greatest malady of our life, the problem of sin. If we acknowledge our sins and seek His forgiveness He will respond. If we place the full weight of our trust in His ability to save us He will bring us back to life from death. And as we submit to Him as the Lord of our lives He will send His Holy Spirit into our hearts to allow us intimacy of relationship with Him and provide us with the power to face all the pain of life with Him. This is the road to salvation. Nothing else in all the world can save us from our pain; only Jesus. Inviting Jesus into our lives does not do away with our pain. In fact, it can bring new and different pains into our lives because the world will begin to rise up against us. But Jesus' presence and power in our lives will enable us to walk through our pain in joy despite our circumstances. Life on earth is marked by pain. I'd rather walk through that pain depending on Jesus than leaning on my own resources.

<u>Thursday</u>: *Read Matthew 28:1-10; Romans 6:1-14; John 11:25-26.* Disruption can bring about resurrection if we entrust our lives to the Lord. Jesus trusted God the Father at His death and He was resurrected. The same will be true of us if we place our trust in Jesus. But we are not just talking about our spiritual resurrection at the end of our lives. Jesus has the power to resurrect every dead thing in our life. He can resurrect our dead marriage. He can resurrect the dead relationship between us and our children. He can resurrect our dead hearts that cannot feel anything anymore. He can resurrect your purpose in life and set you on the most fulfilling adventure possible. There's nothing resurrection can't touch if we entrust our lives to Jesus.

Friday: Read Colossians 1:24, Colossians 2:1-3; 2 Corinthians 4:16-18; James 1:2-4; James 1:12. The pain of disruption is a small price to pay to experience the blessings of resurrection. Life on earth is pain. Anyone who tells you different is trying to sell you something. Pain will disrupt our lives again and again but Jesus wants to use those disruptions to grow us. When we step into the new thing Jesus has for us the pain of walking through disruption will be worth it. The joy of winning a championship is worth the pain of training hard. The health that comes with being cancer free is worth the pain of radiation and chemotherapy. The pain of childbirth is worth it when you hold that baby in your arms. And the pain of disruption is worth the blessings of God that result if we submit our lives to Him.

Our prayer is that today you will place the full weight of your trust in Jesus to rule your life. That you will acknowledge your sin, bring it to Him, ask for forgiveness and trust Him to save you. That you will bow your knee to His Lordship in your life and let Him bring you a new start. The disruption you are experiencing is painful. That pain is real! But Jesus can use it to heal us if we bring it to Him!
