



Going Deeper - May 19, 2024

How To Start A Fire Week 3: Lessons From Gath

Monday: Read Psalm 34:1-22; 1 Samuel 21:6-22:2; Psalm 119:68. I believe that if we read Psalm 34 and 1 Samuel 21 side by side they show us a man after God's own heart, who's seeking God's face not just out of desperation because of his circumstances but because he had experienced the goodness of God all his life. That's the goal as we seek to build a blazing prayer life twig by twig, branch by branch. We want to become people who can navigate the complexities of life because we've developed a simplicity of approach to the Lord in the Secret Place. David knew no other source to depend on but the Lord and he prospered under some of the most difficult circumstances. May the same be true of us. This week, may the Lord show us how seeking Him first can provide escape routes for every danger we face and unshakable peace in the midst of those same dangers.

Tuesday: Read Isaiah 55:8-9; Jeremiah 33:3; John 6:12, 1 Corinthians 2:9-16. Do we have a box for the move that makes no sense? Men and women of God were often led by the Lord to obey Him in ways that defied human logic and good common sense. Jehoshaphat had the worship leaders lead Judah into battle. Joshua led the Israelites on a walk around Jericho. Ananias went and laid hands on Saul who up to that point had arrested every Christian he could get his hands on. Peter obeyed and walked to Jesus on the water. John the Baptist told the world his cousin was the Lamb of God who would take away the sins of the world. Joseph married Mary who had conceived by the Holy Spirit. I point all these stories out because they keep David's flight to Gath in Biblical perspective. It made no sense for the Lord to send David to live among his mortal enemies in the figurative backyard of Goliath's next of kin....but that's exactly what He did. Yet when we juxtaposition this story against so many others in which the logical next move was not what God commanded His people it helps us keep it in perspective. It also challenges us that from time to time we may be asked to make the move that makes no sense. Leave the high paying job to lead that ministry. Stay home to raise your kids though the world tells you, you are throwing your career away. Obeying Jesus' call to the mission field though your parents are dead set against it. Jesus' direction for us often makes no sense because His ways and thoughts are higher than ours. And those ways are best discerned in the Secret Place of prayer not at the kitchen table as you list the pros and cons. As a wise man once said, 'Go into your room, close the door, and pray to Your Father who is in secret...."

Wednesday: Read 1 Samuel 22:1-2; Matthew 11:27-30. People rallied to David. "All those who were in distress or in debt or discontented gathered around him, and he became their leader." We don't know what motivated each of those men to follow David but I think it's reasonable to assume the following: David was loyal. Loyal to a king who envied and feared him...and tried to destroy him. David had a "true north". He wasn't driven by circumstances but by God's leadership of his life. David was a man worth following. He wasn't motivated by selfish ambition but by love for God. And David was a man after God's own heart. And while all those men did not throw their lot in with David because he was godly, I believe his godliness brought the favor of God down on David. His victories point to that. His deliverance from the most treacherous circumstances reveal that. His being chosen by God as a teenager and his being elevated to the throne from being exiled in the desert affirm it. If we will allow the Holy Spirit to develop us into the God lover and God obeyer that David was, people will rally to us as well. Why? Because Jesus will be able to live His life through us. He'll be able to invite people to come to Him through us so that they might find rest. May we become places of refuge for those who are in need.

Thursday: Read 1 Samuel 21:10-15; Psalm 34. Gath was preparation. It was a training ground for what David would experience over the next few years fleeing from Saul. In Gath David learned that God could deliver him out of the hands of a powerful king without David having to lift a finger to defend himself. In Gath David learned that surrounded by your enemies is the safest place you can be if God leads you there. In Gath David learned that there is no place that God's eye cannot see and that His hand cannot reach. And in Gath David learned that when we call on the Lord He delivers us from all our troubles and all our fears. When God tells us to go to our "Gath", we often baulk because it seems to dangerous. When we find ourselves in "Gath" we often despair because the circumstances seem overwhelming. But when we finally leave "Gath" behind, we know our God and we trust our God as we never have before.

<u>Friday:</u> Read Matthew 6:6, Psalm 131:1-2; Isaiah 26:20; Psalm 34:1-8. Our time with the Lord is bigger than us. Yes, it provides us with peace. Yes, it takes us to deeper places with the Lord. Yes, it gives us access to the power of God, the plan of God and the provisions of God. But it's bigger than that. David sought the Lord as he fled from Saul and the Lord answered him. The Lord filled him with such overwhelming peace and joy that burst out into worship and invited the afflicted who had come to him to worship with him. His deliverance foreshadowed their deliverance. His joy lifted their grief. His worship took their eyes off their circumstances and lifted them on to the God whom David trusted. Your time with the Lord is not just about you. It's about the growth and development of your children. The transformation of your work environment. The stabilizing of your neighborhood. And the redeeming of this world. Every great move of God began by someone committing to get alone with their God and refuse to leave His presence until something changed. May we be the next generation who does the same!
